


Berlin Youth Club





In the Beginning: Understanding Creation

What Does It Mean?

When we speak of creation, we mean everything that exists outside of God. This encompasses heavens and earth, people and animals, even the smallest particles and the vastest galaxies. All of it belongs to God, the Creator.

Christians confess creatio ex nihilo, latin for "creation out of nothing". Before God spoke, there was no matter, energy, or time. Unlike us, who always create out of something, God created freely and lovingly without any starting point. Nothing compelled Him. Out of sheer will and goodness, He brought the universe into being.

This doctrine reminds us that creation itself is the ongoing testimony that God is sovereign, free, and loving. This is what Christians mean when we say "God created."

Why Do Christians Adhere to It?

This belief is rooted in Scripture.

Genesis 1:1 proclaims, "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth." Though the text describes God ordering chaos into form, it also affirms that all things, such as light, darkness, land, and sea, first existed only because God willed them.

Romans 4:17 speaks of God "who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist." Paul stresses that God creates without relying on prior material.

Isaiah 40:25-26 reminds us to "lift up your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these?" Even the stars themselves exist only because God called them forth.

From beginning to end, Scripture consistently shows God as the sole source of all that exists. This is why Christians cling to creatio ex nihilo: it is not speculation, but a conviction grounded in God's Word.

Why Does It Matter for Us Today?

Believing that God created out of nothing shapes how we see ourselves and how we live.

First, it shows God's intimacy with His creation. He did not create and walk away but continues to sustain and love what He has made. The same God who flung galaxies into space knows the hairs on your head. Recognizing this helps us understand our own creatureliness. We are not self-made, but dependent on God's constant care.

Second, it shapes how we treat the world and one another. If all belongs to God, then every person is worthy of dignity, and every corner of creation is a gift to be stewarded with gratitude. To live as creatures is to live humbly, honoring the Creator in our relationships, work, and care for the earth.

Finally, it gives us hope in the face of evil. If God created all things and called them good, then evil cannot be part of His creation. Evil is not a substance but the absence or corruption of goodness. It works by decay, not by creation. The most evil act humanity ever committed, crucifying our Creator and Lord, did not overcome God's goodness. Instead, it became the very means of our redemption. We cannot solve evil on our own, but we trust God's promise: one day "all tears will be wiped away" (Revelation 21:4). From beginning to end, God's purpose has remained the same. Though evil exists, we live in hope, trusting that the One who created out of nothing will bring forth a new creation where all will be made whole again.
